- 3 Options
 - Project Online
 - Project Pro for Office 365 (incl. desktop client subscription for up to 5 PCs)
 - Project Online with Project Pro for Office 365 (incl. everything)
- Same code-stream

Project Online Benefits

- No infrastructure maintenance (focus on delivery)
- Available on demand
- Available anywhere on any client (no vpn, no windows)
- Spin up Project Server is simple /user /month
- Near instantaneous streaming of the desktop apps
 - Click to Run subscription installs for Project Online (5 per user)

PWA Improvements

- Mobile
 - Lightweight monitoring, scheduling and tasks mgmt
- Browser support same as SharePoint
- Exchange Server integration
 - Calendaring and tasks
- Baselines, timeline and autocalc in PWA
- UI simpler than Project Professional

Other Improvements

- SharePoint Task Lists
 - Anyone can interact with project plan easily
 - Consolidated Task List (sites, projects, personal, Outlook)
 - SharePoint tasks show in Outlook
- SharePoint Designer 2013 authored workflows
 - Visual workflow development w/o Visual Studio

Other Improvements

- Timesheets simplified
 - Filtered list of projects
 - Admin tasks next to project tasks
- Security simplified
 - Easily use SharePoint security groups
- BI/Reporting using oData
- Lync directly from Project Pro 2013

Migration to PS 2013

- Database attach method
 - No "in-place" method
- Project Professional 2013 (only) connects to (only)
 Project Server 2013
- **2**007 -> 2010 -> 2013
- Databases consolidated
 - 4 DB's (Archived, Draft, Published, Report) -> 1 DB
