Project Success Measures


Definition

- suc-cess: the favorable or prosperous termination of attempts or endeavors
- meas-ure: any standard of comparison, estimation, or judgment

In project management the *real* definition is a matter of perspective and is a collection success measures


What are project success measures?

Success Measures - PM Perspective




Traditional Measures


Success Measures - Stakeholder Perspective

Why are they important?

Measure Project Performance

- Good metrics:
 - Are Early warning signs (leading not trailing)
 - Prompt early action to correct issues before they become HUGE problems
 - Aid in effective project control
 - Are important communication vehicles between the project and project stakeholders
- What gets measured, gets done (P. Drucker)
- Continuous review of metrics, milestones and objectives leads to project success

Measures for Continuous Improvement of Project Management

Unplanned project changes

- · May need better requirements
- ·WBS may not go low enough

Number of identified risks

- · Risk identification may need to be improved
- ·Tracking of too many risks

Amount of rework

- · Planning may not be to the appropriate level of detail
- III-defined requirements

Budget, Quality, Schedule variances

·May need more detailed estimating and planning

Post-project reviews

- •Top 3-5 things that went well/did not go well
- •Be sure to use the results

Satisfaction surveys

•What changes do we need to improve stakeholders point of view

Value Realization

- Measures align all stakeholders on the true business need / value
- Determination of success is not possible unless measures are defined and baselined
- Allows meaningful prioritization of efforts (the organization is working on the right things)
- Look in the review mirror did we get the value we thought we would


