Illinois Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Illinois account for 12.83% of the total output in the state, employing 9.44% of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$114.73 billion in 2021. In addition, there were an average of 557,000 manufacturing employees in Illinois in December 2021, with an average annual compensation of \$97,323.90 in 2021.

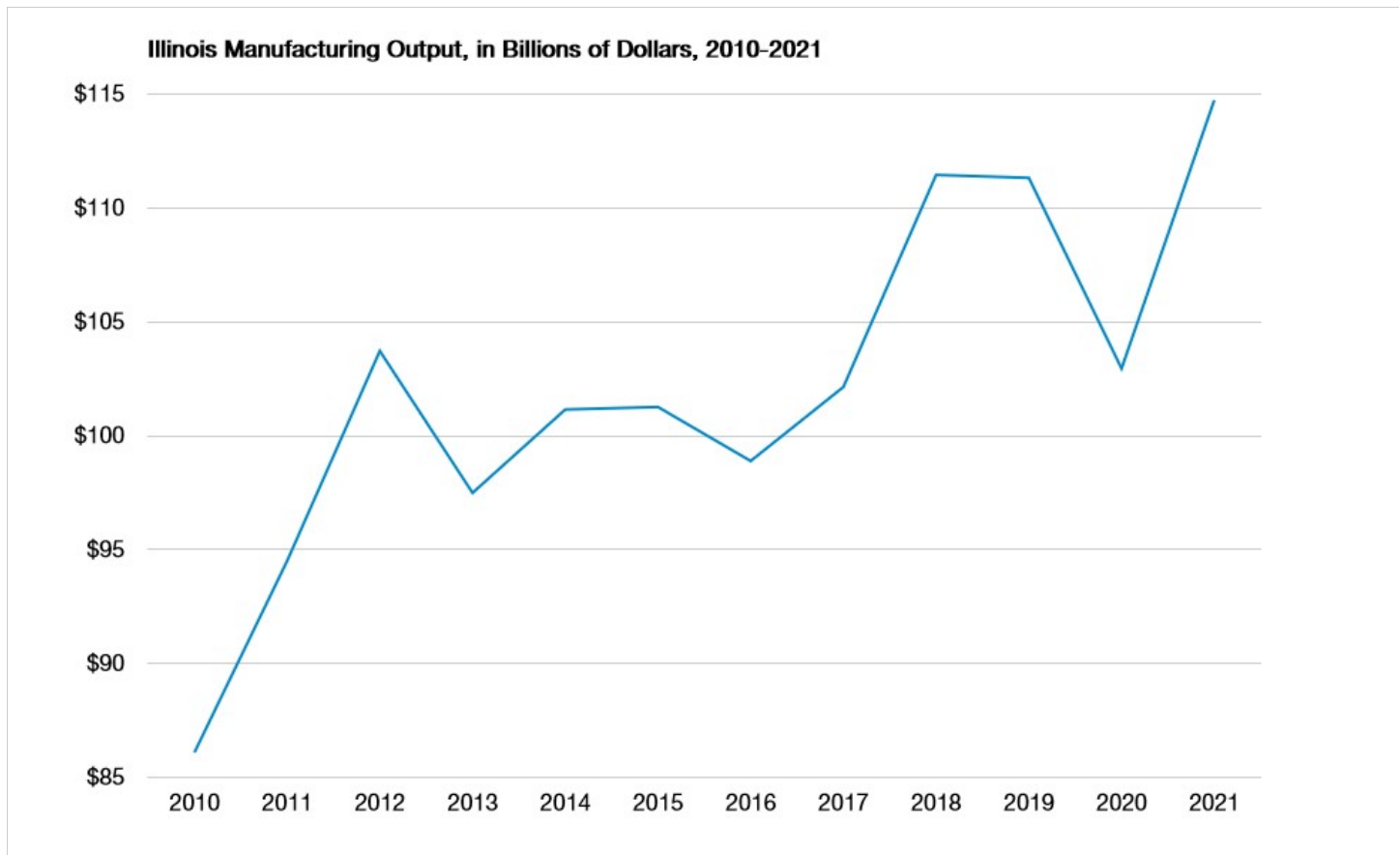

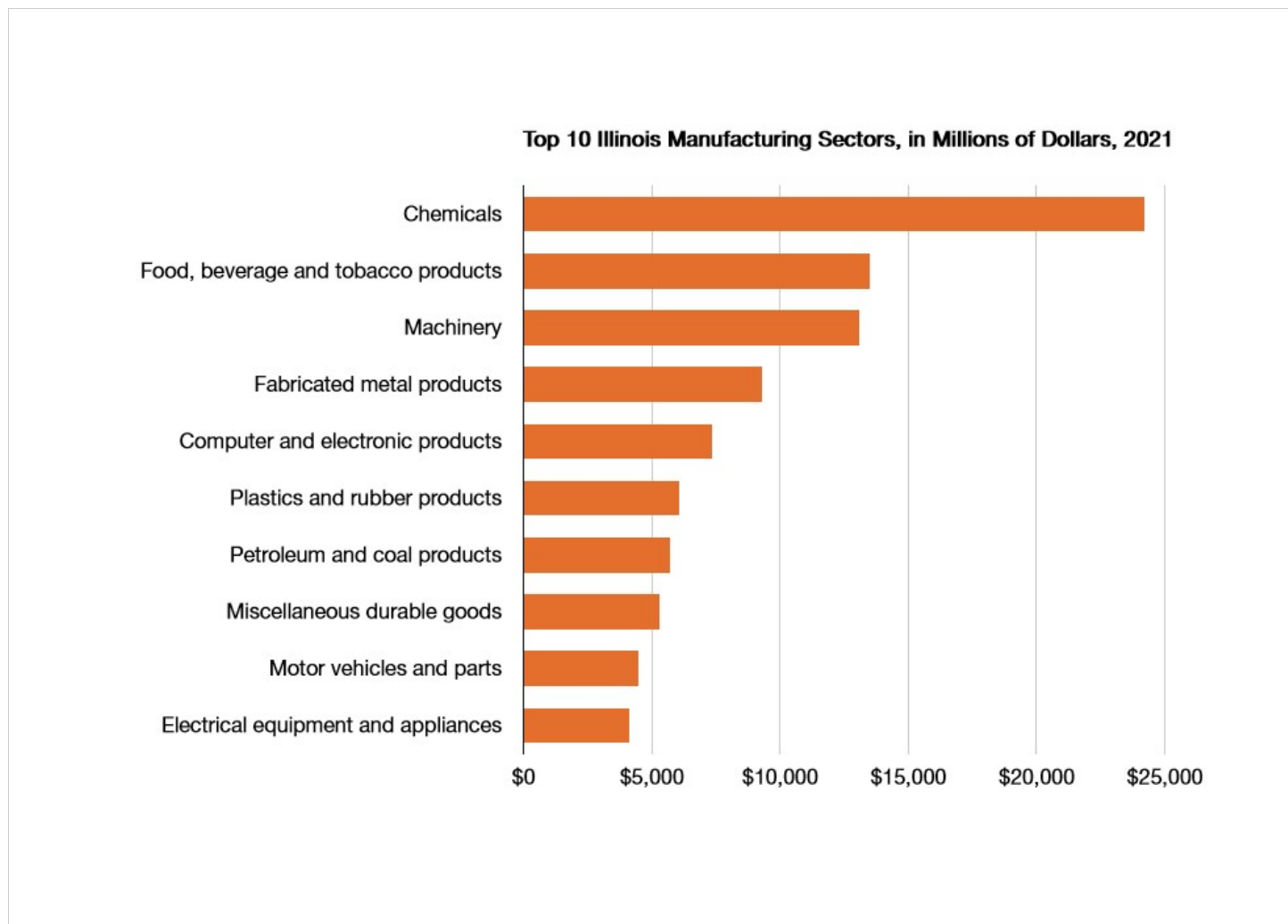
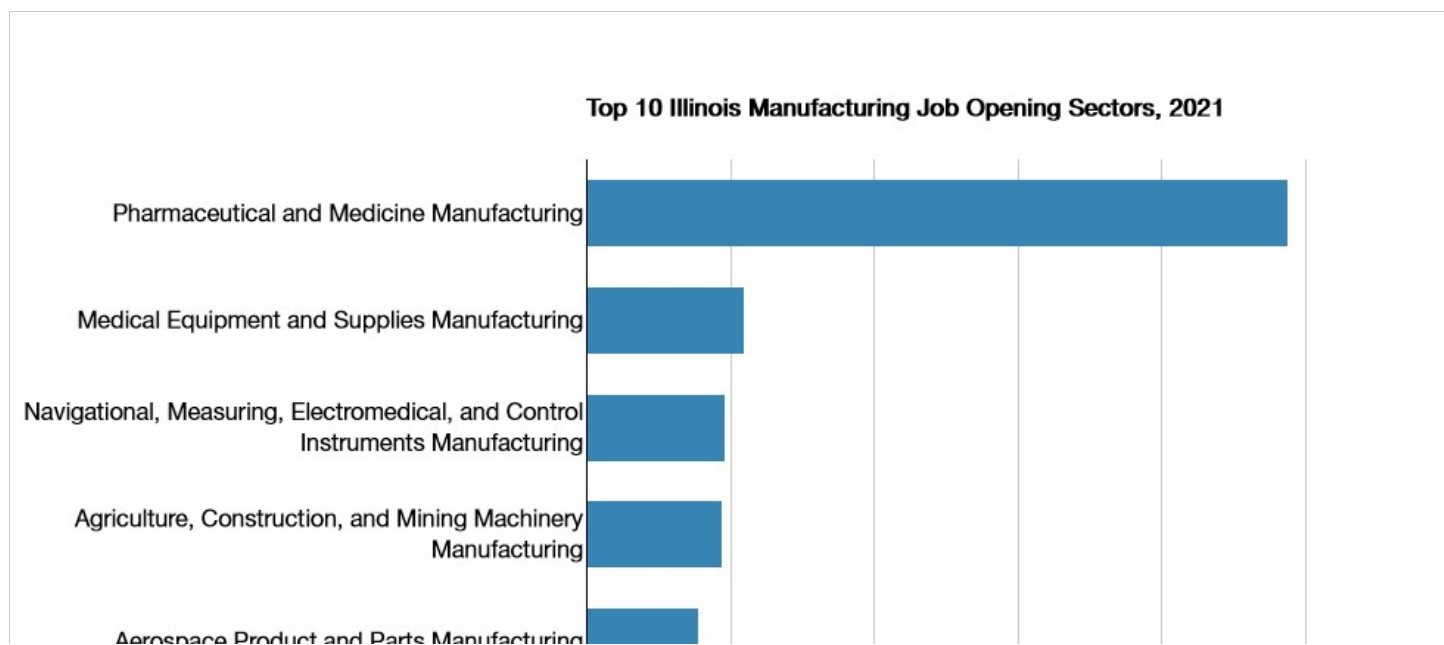
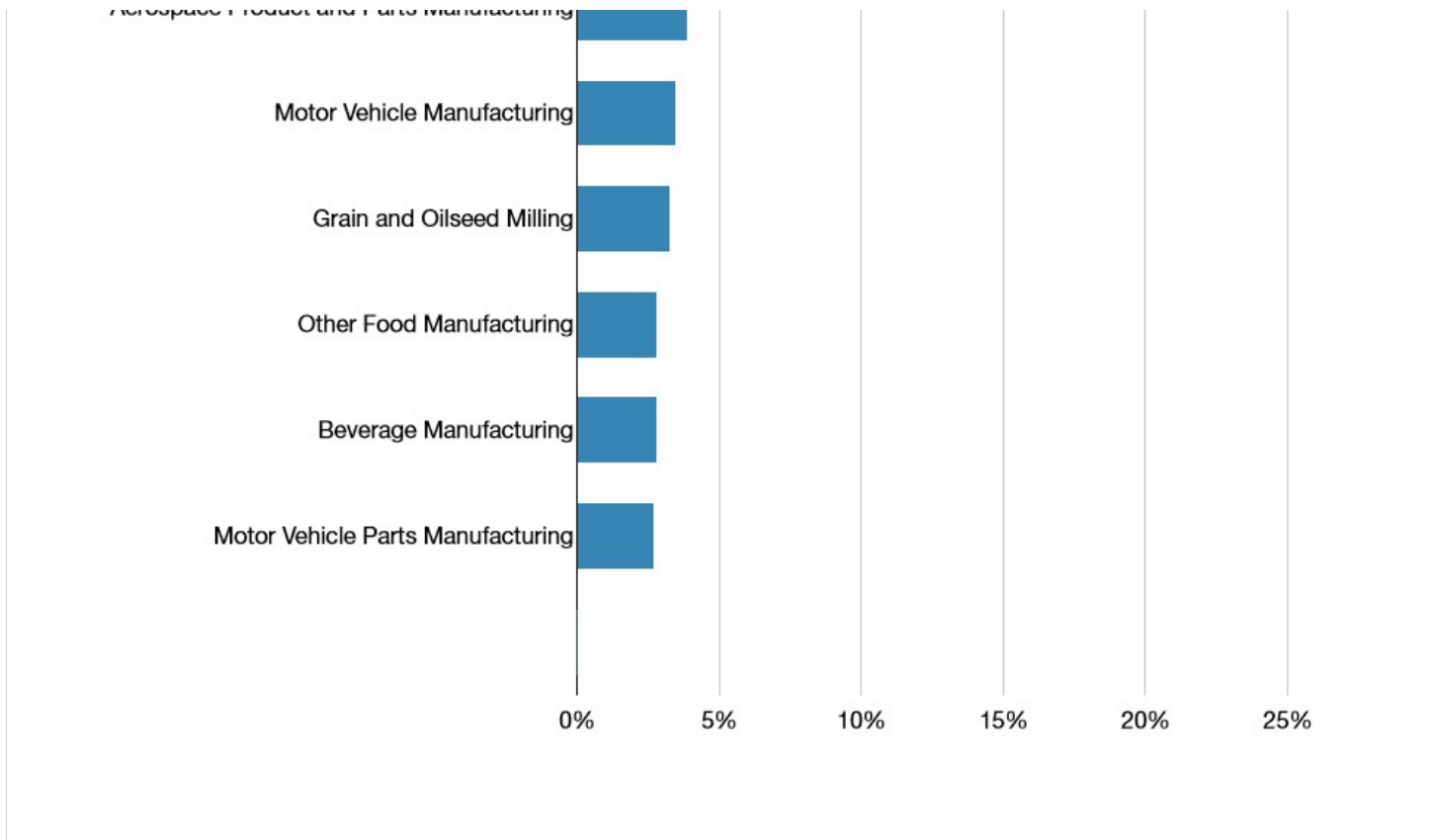

Manufactured Goods Exports (\$billions, 2021) **\$62.21**

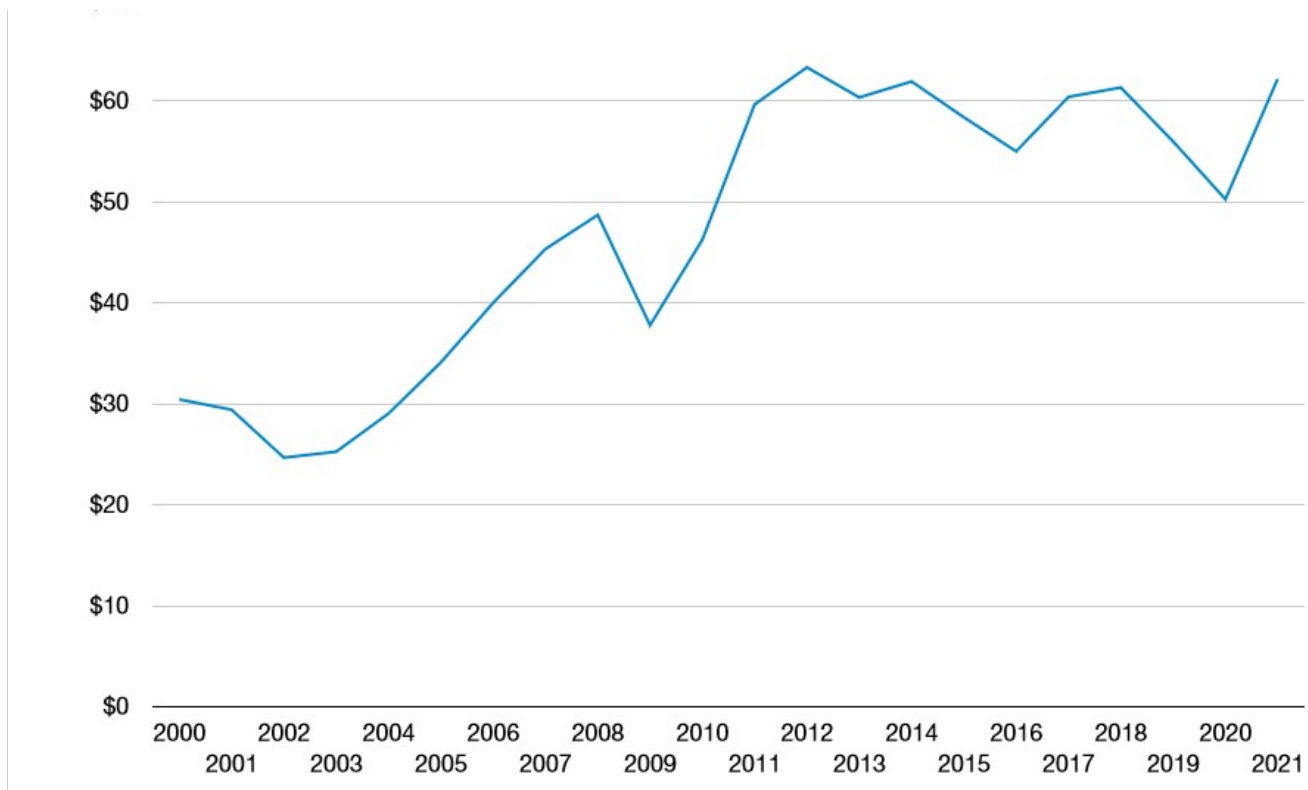

Additional Trade Facts

- The 20 U.S. FTA partners purchased 49.38% (\$690.92 billion) of U.S. manufactured goods exports in 2021 – even though these countries represent only six percent of the world’s population and 10 percent of GDP.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
