Your academic advisor is part of SOAR (Student Opportunities for Academic Results), a specialized advising department that provides enhanced support to help you transition to college.

First-year students who are first-generation college students, Pell-eligible, and/or part of an underrepresented group are eligible for SOAR. Our students benefit from:

- **Transition Support:** SOAR students are selected as incoming freshmen and are provided with support to aid in the transition to college life.
- **Specialized Guidance:** Our committed and caring team of academic advisors, success coach, and staff is experienced in proactively serving and mentoring students who face a unique set of needs and challenges. Extra measures are taken to address early warning signs, connect students to resources, and involve parents as necessary.
- **Foundational Programming:** In addition to academic advising, SOAR provides supplemental academic support and opportunities for personal development and career readiness.

Boundless Scholar Experience (BSE)

As a first-year student, you are part of the Boundless Scholar Experience (BSE). This comprehensive program is administered by SOAR and is designed to promote belonging, academic advancement, and degree completion. Students will complete several general education courses together and engage in robust co-curricular programming to establish a strong collegiate foundation. BSE includes enrollment in ENG 125 on your fall semester schedule. This course will fulfill general education requirements for first semester transition, global cultures, race and equity experience, health experience, and breadth-humanities.
