



# 2024 Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey

## Introduction and Background

Southern Illinois University Edwardsville is committed to fostering an inclusive and safe campus environment. Preventing and remedying sexual misconduct is essential to SIUE’s mission. The university conducted the *Sexual Climate Misconduct Survey* in the Spring of 2024 to better understand students’ experiences of sexual misconduct (which includes sexual or gender-based harassment, stalking, dating/domestic violence, and sexual violence), students’ knowledge of the resources available to them, and perception of the response to incidents of sexual misconduct.

On August 6, 2021, a bill was signed into law by amending the Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education Act. This new law, Public Act 102-0325 (110 ILCS 155/35), mandated all institutions of higher education conduct an annual campus sexual misconduct climate survey to assess students’ experiences, outcomes regarding their experiences, and perceptions of sexual violence and collegiate culture. The law called for the creation of a Task Force on Sexual Misconduct on Campus Climate Surveys to develop the base survey instrument and implementation guidance. The survey conducted by SIUE follows the task force’s base survey.

### Administration

Southern Illinois University Edwardsville administered the survey to students from **March 18-April 15, 2024**, with a total duration of 28 days. 11,333 students were invited to participate in the survey, which was advertised through emails, flyers, and instructor announcements. Students who completed the survey were eligible to register for the chance to win \$100 in Cougar Bucks (for spending on-campus and with select off-campus establishments). Ten \$100 awards were randomly selected. The software program Qualtrics was used to administer the online survey to students.
