# EYE AY26 Priority Areas

1. Course redesign projects that utilize inclusive, student-centered pedagogies to address equity gaps, improve the achievement of student learning outcomes, and enhance retention. Courses that have high numbers of sections, a high ratio of D/F/W grades, or those key required courses with high enrollments and opportunities to improve equitable student success will be prioritized.
2. Development or revision of courses with the IS designation specific to SIUE Changemakers. These courses should: align to a specific Changemakers Pathway and integrate the high impact practices of either collaborative learning or community-engaged learning.

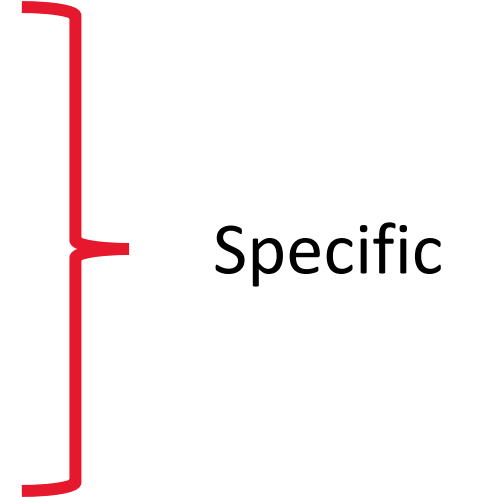

- Changemakers will allow students to apply their college education to creatively address problems and transform the world during and after their college experience. The courses center project-based, experiential learning and integrate High Impact Practices. Changemakers offers thematic pathways through the Lincoln program that foster connections across general education coursework by giving students the choice of a problem or idea to explore through multiple perspectives and disciplines.

  - Periodic, Structured Opportunities to Reflect & Integrate Learning

  - Public Demonstration of Competence

# EUE Application Components

- Project Narrative
  - 500 word limit
  - 6-page double-spaced
  - Project Budget, Budget Justification, and Cost Sharing Summary (in this file, but not included in word/page limit)
    - 7/1/2025-6/30/2026
    - Summer Salary: 1 month or \$9,000 whichever is less
    - Assigned Time: allowable at the rate of an adjunct lecturer (requires support in Chair or Dean letter)
    - Equipment: Must expand curricular offerings or provide access to new, field specific technology
    - Cost Sharing:
      - The purchase of any idea that students would normally purchase for themselves should request ~1/3 the budget from EUE other costs must be shared
      - Equipment >\$5,000 requires 20% cost sharing
      - Recurring Projects should provide evidence of match support
    - Not allowable: multi-year funding, travel study, computer lab/classroom outfitting, honoraria/awards to faculty, overload for 12 month fac/staff, tuition, replacement of instructional equipment
    - *All budget items must adhere to current SIUE contractual services*
  - Biosketch (2 pages/applicant)
  - Appendices (if approved)

# EUE Application Components

- Support Statement from Chair and Dean
  - Include Memos with Application
- Results from Prior EUE Support (if applicable)
  - 1000 words or less describing project and outcomes

# Review Criteria & Recommendations

- Faculty Development Council (FDC) distribute and review complete applications
- Proposals that fit the current EUE priority areas are given preference
- FDC forwards recommendations to the Provost (April)
- Project Directors will receive summarized feedback from the panel for both funded & unfunded proposals
