- The African Studies minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- Elective choices: FL 101, FL 102, HIS 222 and Geography 132 (Geography majors cannot apply this class toward the
- The African Studies minor is currently administered by the Department of Geography.
- Prospective students with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 may apply for admission into the African Studies Minor.
- The African Studies Minor at Southern Illinois University Edwardsville is an interdisciplinary undergraduate program with the central goal of developing students' knowledge and understanding of African people, their land, history, culture, economy, socio-cultural institutions, traditional power structures and the African Diaspora. It provides students the opportunity to fully appreciate the global impacts of African cultures and histories on the art, music, religion, language, and other spheres of the human endeavors.

- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

- The Art History minor consists of 18 credit hours.

#### **Art/Studio Art:**

- The Studio Art minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- Students select ONE TRACK in which to minor: 2-D, 3-D or Digital. Digital is Photography or Graphic Design.
- ART 103 (2-D or Digital Track); 115 (3-D Track); 150 (required for all Tracks).
- Students may choose from among the following: ART 112 (2-D Track); ART 112 (3-D Track); (Digital Track; an additional Graphic Design class will be needed at SIUE.)
- All Tracks will require 2 Track advanced courses at SIUE.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

Asian Studies: SIUE contact: Dr. Jason Yu, jyu@siue.edu

- The Asian Studies minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- All courses will be taken at SIUE.
- The Asian Studies Minor is an interdisciplinary program that introduces students to the diverse cultures, histories and societies of Asia.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

**Biological Sciences:** SIUE contact – Department of Biological Sciences, (618) 650-3928

- The Biological Sciences minor consists of 19 credit hours.
- BIO 111, 112
- At least 9 of the 20 hours must be completed at SIUE.

#### **Biological Sciences (Cont.)**

- Students must receive a grade of C or better in each course before proceeding to the next course at SIUE.
- Due to the sequencing of courses and/or required prerequisites, this minor may take in excess of two and a half years to complete.

- The Black Studies minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- HIS 211, HIS 212
- Nine hours of minor electives should be chosen from at least three different departments, and at least three courses toward the minor must be related to the Black experience in America.

<u>Business Administration:</u> SIUE contact – School of Business Student Services (618) 650-3840

- The Business Administration minor consists of 21 credit hours.
- ACC 103, ECO 131 and 132
- Students must have a 2.25 cumulative GPA to declare a Business Administration minor.
- A College of Arts & Sciences Economics major may not count ECO 131 and 132 toward a Business Administration minor.
- Students majoring in any discipline in the School of Business may not minor in Business Administration.

<u>Bioprocess Chemistry: -</u> SIUE contact – Department of Chemistry, (618) 650-2042

- A minor in bioprocess chemistry in chemistry requires 24-37 hours with a GPA of 2.0 or higher. The minor must contain freshman level chemistry, organic chemistry, a biochemistry class and one of the biology classes listed below in addition to the Bioprocess Chemistry sequence.

- The Chemistry minor consists of 24 credit hours.
- CHE 101, 102, 201 and 202
- At least 6 of the 24 hours must be completed at SIUE.
- Requires a GPA of 2.0 or higher in all courses.

<u>Classical Studies:</u> SIUE contact – Dr. Carl Springer, <u>casprin@siue.edu</u>

- The Classical Studies minor consists of 20 credit hours.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.
- The Classical Studies minor contributes to cultural enrichment through the study of Latin and Greek, and of the history, philosophy, literature, and art of the Greek and Roman civilizations.

<u>Computer Engineering:</u> SIUE contact – Engineering Student Services (618) 650-5300

- The Computer Engineering minor consists of 23 credit hours.
- ENG 270 and CSC 270 (Students must meet all prerequisites for these courses.)

#### Computer Engineering (Cont.)

A cumulative 2.0 or above GPA is required for all Computer
 Science and Electrical Engineering courses.

<u>Computer Science:</u> SIUE contact – Engineering Student Services (618) 650-5300

- The Computer Science minor consists of 22 credit hours.
- CSC 170 and 270 (Students must meet all prerequisites for these courses.)
- At least 6 of the 24 hours must be completed at SIUE.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

<u>Construction Management:</u> SIUE contact – Engineering Student Services (618) 650-5300

- The Construction Management minor consists of 21 credit hours.
- The courses are to be selected from the Construction curriculum with approval from the chair of the SIUE Construction Department.
- A cumulative 2.0 or above GPA is required for all Construction Management courses.

- The Criminal Justice minor consists of 21 credit hours.
- Up to 9 hours of transfer, credit can be accepted.
- Choose from the following: CRJ 100, 140, 130, 201, 203, and 260
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

<u>Digital Humanities and Social Sciences:</u> SIUE contact – Dr. Jessica DeSpain, <u>idespai@siue.edu</u> or Dr. Kristine Hildebrandt, <u>khildeb@siue.edu</u>

- The Digital Humanities and Social Science miner consists of 19 credit hours.
- Required courses for the minor are offered at SIUE only.
- Students should select 4 electives that are relevant to their majors and future plans. Pre-approved electives include courses from the following departments: English (SIUE only), Geography (GEG 105 LLCC/241 SIUE. Both must be taken), Interdisciplinary Studies (SIUE only), Mass Communication (JRN 101), Computer Concepts and Applications (CAS 121, Computer Science (CSC 105) and Applied Communication Studies (SIUE only).
- Any courses used toward a student's major cannot be applied for the minor.

#### **Economics:**

- The Economics minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- ECO 131 and 132
- MAT 141 is a prerequisite for the required ECON 301 and 302, which will be taken at SIUE.
- Additional 300-400 level ECON courses are required, with some having MAT 130 as a prerequisite.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

<u>Education Studies & Analysis</u>: SIUE contact – School of Education, Health, and Human Behavior (618) 650-3940 or soeadvise@siue.edu

- The Education Studies & Analysis minor consists of a minimum 21 credit hours.
- LLCC students are eligible to take 3 of the following: EDU 201, EDU 210, PSY 101.

#### **Education Studies & Analysis: (Cont.):**

- Students must complete at least 12 hours of the minimum 21 credit hours at SIUE. Six of the 12 hours must be at the 400 level and 6 at the 300-400 level.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

### **<u>Electrical Engineering:</u>** SIUE contact - – Engineering Student Services (618) 650-5300

- The Electrical Engineering minor consists of 24 credit hours.
- ENG 270 (Students must meet all prerequisites for this course.)
- A cumulative 2.0 or above GPA is required for all Electrical Engineering Courses

- The English/Creative minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- JRN 101
- This minor **may** be combined with a major in English.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

#### English/Literature: SIUE contact – Valerie Vogrin, vvogrin@siue.edu

- The English/Literature minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- This minor *may not* be combined with the English major.
- All courses should be selected with the approval of the SIUE English Department's undergraduate advisor.
- Appropriate courses in creative writing, expository writing & linguistics may be included as supplements to the literature courses.
  - Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses

### <u>English/Linguistics:</u> SIUE contact – Kristine Hildebrandt, <u>khildeb@siue.edu</u>

- The English/Linguistics minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- This minor **may** be combined with a major in English.
- Students are encouraged to take EGL 150
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

### <u>English/Rhetoric & Writing:</u> SIUE contact – Valerie Vogrin, vvogrin@siue.edu

- The English/Rhetoric minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- This minor *may* be combined with a major in English.
- All minor coursework will be completed at SIUE.

#### Environmental Sciences: Phone: 618-650-3551

- The Environmental Science minor consists of 17 credit hours
- Students must apply for and be accepted into the Minor program in Environmental Sciences. The deadline for fall and spring admission is April 15 and October 15, respectively. Minimum requirements for admission are a cumulative GPA of 2.5.

- The European Studies minor consists of 34 credit hours.
- HIS 101 or HIS 102 (Prerequisite to program)
- \*\*FL 101, 102, 201, and 202. (Spanish, French or German and Japanese offered at LLCC.)

#### **European Studies/Civilizations (Cont.):**

- At least one course must be taken in three of four areas: Geography, History, Political Science or Foreign Language (Above FL courses are prerequisites to additional Foreign Language courses, if chosen.) Additional courses may be approved by the European Coordinator.
- Students cannot count courses for their major towards their minor.

#### Exercise & Sport Psychology:

- The Exercise & Sport Psychology minor consists of 24 credit hours.
- Students must complete 12 hours of the 24 required credit hours at SIUE.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.
- A 2.5 GPA is required for admission to the minor, retention, and graduation.

#### Forensic Science:

- The Forensic Science minor consists of 19 credit hours.
- AOJ 100, 203, 251
- CHEM 101, 103, 105, 201 and 202
- \*BIOL 101 and 102, 105, \*157 and 158
- The Forensic Science minor requires at least one AOJ class, at least one BIOL class, only one CHEM class and at least one ANTH class (only available at SIUE).
- \*Note BIOL 101 and 102 counts as two courses but <u>must</u> be taken as a sequence. The same applies to BIOL 157and 158.
- All courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.
- Courses applied to the minor may overlap with courses taken for the major.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

### <u>Foreign Language and Literature</u> SIUE contact – Department of Foreign Language & Literature, 618-650-3501.

- The French, German, Spanish minors consists of 21 credit hours.
- FL 101, 102, 201, 202
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

#### Geography:

- The Geography minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- The Geography minor requires one human course, one physical course, one regional course (GEG 102) and 3 elective courses. (two of which can be taken at LLCC)
- GEG 211 acts as one Geography elective. Students may select as their second elective: GEG 105
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

#### Health, Society, and the Human Condition (Cont.):

- The Health, Society, and the Human Condition minor consists of 18 credit hours, with a minimum of 3 courses at the 300- 400 level.
- The minor in Health, Society, and the Human Condition is an interdisciplinary minor administered by the Department of Applied Communication Studies with participating units and departments that include Anthropology, Applied Health, Biological Sciences, Foreign Languages and Literature, Geography, Mass Communications, and Psychology. The minor can provide opportunities for focusing on issues of medical ethics, equality of access to healthcare, and holistic perspectives on health.
   Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses

- Three survey courses must be taken for the SIUE History minor. At least one course must be European or world history (EW), and one course must be American history (A).
- HIS 101(E), 102 (E), 111 (A), 112 (A) and 211 and 212 (A)

### *Industrial Engineering:* SIUE contact – Engineering Student Services, 618-650-5300.

- The Industrial Engineering minor consists of 21 credit hours.
- Students must meet all Industrial Engineering prerequisites.
- Requires a cumulative 2.0 GPA or higher for all Industrial Engineering courses.

- The Latin American Studies minor consists of 21 credit hours.
- Students who pursue this minor complete a concentration
  of courses, which focus on Latin American culture, history,
  politics, the environment, economics, and the arts. This
  minor is especially appropriate for students planning to
  enter professions such as government service, international
  relations, international business, teaching, and
  environmental sciences. All courses are at the 300-400
  level and will be taken at SIUE.

- Students must meet all Manufacturing Engineering prerequisites.
- Requires a cumulative 2.0 GPA or higher for all Manufacturing Engineering courses.

- The Mass Communications minor consists of 21 credit hours.
- Required courses for minor: JRN 222, JRN 101.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

<u>Mathematical Studies:</u> SIUE contact – Department of Mathematics and Statistics. 618-650-2382

- The Mathematics minor consists of 19 credit hours.
- Required courses for minor: MAT 131 & 132
- Students must complete nine hours of Mathematics, Statistics or Operations Research at the 200 level or above and at least six hours at the \*\*300 level or above at SIUE.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all Mathematics,
   Statistics or Operational Research courses that count toward minor requirements.
- Students majoring in Mathematical Studies may not minor in Mathematics, Statistics.

### <u>Mechanical Engineering:</u> SIUE contact – Engineering Student Services, 618-650-5300.

- The Mechanical Engineering minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- ENG 221 (Students must complete the Mechanical Engineering course prerequisites.)
- Requires a cumulative 2.0 GPA or higher for all Mechanical Engineering courses.

- Remaining courses are to be taken at SIUE.
- Requires a cumulative 2.0 GPA or higher for all Mechatronics

- MUS 100, 104
- Students choose a concentration from the following: Performance, Theory, History & Literature, Jazz, Music Education or Music Business.
- Students are required to audition for a majority of concentrations.

- Courses for the major (if one of the abovementioned departments) may not count towards the minor.
- The minor in Native American Studies is an interdisciplinary minor administered by the Department of Anthropology that

 will permit students to study Native Americans from a variety of scholarly and Native perspectives. The Native American Studies minor raises awareness of central issues for Native Americans by critically examining their past, present, and future through diverse bodies of evidence such as material culture, oral histories, ethno-history, and ethnography. All courses are at the 3-400 level and will be taken at SIUE.

- The PSTM minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- The minor in PSTM is an interdisciplinary minor administered by the Departments of Historical Studies and Philosophy.
- The PSTM minor at SIUE is multi-disciplinary and provides an opportunity for students to engage broader questions about science, technology, and medicine; their place in human history; their social and political dimensions; as well as their norms and essential character.
- The PTSM minor draws from various contributing programs: History, Philosophy, Sociology, English, Anthropology, Political Science, and Psychology.
   Prerequisites may be required before taking courses in some of the above areas.

- PHI 201 does not count toward minor.
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

*Physics:* SIUE contact – Department of Physics, 618-650-2472

- The Philosophy minor consists of 22 credit hours.
- PHY 201 and 202,203

#### Physics (Cont.):

Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

#### **Political Science:**

- The Political Science minor consists of 18 credit hours.
- POS 101 and POLS 111 at (SIUE) are required.
- Additional courses from which to choose: POS 201, 202
- Grades of "C" or above are required for all minor courses.

#### Pre-Law:

- The Pre-law minor consists of 21 credit hours.
- Students are required to choose ONE course from 6 areas:
   Written Communication (all options at SIUE), Oral
   Communication (CMN 201), Principles of Law CRJ 206
   Theory/Application of Law (HIS 112), and Approved Elective
   (ACC 101, ECO 131, ECO 132, MAT 130, MAT 141, MAT 220,
   PHI 205)
- Students are given 300 level course options in choosing ONE minor course to be taken at SIUE. At least four additional courses must be at the 300-400 level and earned at SIUE. Therefore, students should not rely on taking a course in all of the above 6 areas.

- For transfer students who transfer in credits that apply toward the minor, 12 credits must be at the 300-400 level with at least 6 hours at the 400 level. Therefore, LLCC students are eligible to take 2 of the following: PSY 214, 216.
