Location of research/creative activities:

Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?

My research examines gender role attitudes including masculinity and sexism and developmentally among emerging adults. I am predominantly interested in how gender-based attitudes impact the lives of individuals, including their mental health, and interpersonal processes. This lab will explore these areas using quantitative research through secondary research and survey methods. I have data from the 2024 presidential election that students could analyze, and I also plan on collecting data centered around students' interests.

Brief description of student responsibilities?

Duties will vary based on student availability and interest in projects. In my current project, students may conduct peer reviewed literature searches, organize and clean datasets (using SPSS), assist with running analyses, and help with writing conference proposals and posters.

URCA Assistant positions are designed to provide students with *research or creative activities* experience. As such, there should be measurable, appropriate outcome goals. What exactly should your student(s) have learned by the end of this experience?

Students will learn how to clean and organize datasets. They will also gain experience using SPSS and possibly learn how to run analyses such as correlations, regressions, and ANOVAs. Students will also gain knowledge on how to conduct a literature review, creating methods/results write-ups, and how to create posters.
