Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?

The purpose of this study is to understand how non-professional choirs and choirs that do not operate under the auspices of an educational institute (high school, collegiate) choose their repertoire, how they rehearse it (practices followed) and, eventually, whether there is a correlation between aesthetic qualities of the repertoire and rehearsal practices. Students will interview singers of church/community choirs, as well as directors of these groups, asking them about their experience, methodology, and practices that they follow while in preparation for concerts. Furthermore, students will seek to compile a database of musical choices that have been performed by these choirs in the past, by examining concert programs and other related data.

Brief description of student responsibilities?

Student will be responsible for interviewing community/church choir members regarding their experiences, as well as documenting meticulous records of repertoire performed by such groups in the recent past.
