Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?

Students have the opportunity to work on different ongoing research projects in the lab. We are currently running 4 different eye-tracking studies.

- 1. Reading and learning new words from reading (includes bilingual students)
- 2. Disambiguating words: the role of word knowledge
- 3. Morphological effects on learning new words
- 4. The impact of visual information in textbooks.

Additionally, we are currently developing a study to investigate cognitive failures and the relationship to attention impairments.

Lastly, we have begun developing a project focused on understanding and supporting the literacy skills of the larger community, with an emphasis on aging adult readers.

Brief description of student responsibilities?

Students responsibilities are varied and can depend on student interest and lab needs. All students are encouraged to learn how to use the eye tracker for data collection. Interested students can learn how to create new eye tracking programs and how to analyze eye tracking data. Students who return to the lab often become the lead on a particular project. In this case, students are involved in every step of the research process from planning through dissemination. Students may be asked to perform literature reviews, write article summaries, create and/or review experimental methods, create Qualtrics surveys, report descriptive statistics, create instructions, manuals, and other lab files. They may also be asked to contribute to the lab website, contact participants, and organize files.
