Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?

Within political science, there has been significant growth in the number of people studying environmental policy without using rudimentary case studies, publicly available information, polling data and/or survey investigations. Part of the rapid and significant growth of new environmental policy research is explained by the number of political scientists incorporating social media into their research agendas. This project is about finding innovative "big data" to answer environemtal science questions about natural resource management.

Brief description of student responsibilities?

As data science becomes more commonplace in public administration, academics must celebrate the innovation of social scientists. It is my argument that policy analysts today are eager to be treated with the respect that medical scientists get for contributing to health care policy or that engineers who inform development of safety regulations receive.
