Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?

The student will participate in the virtual 3d scanning and digital curation of real human skeletal remains. These remains are without contextual background, and have been given to SIUE from other institutions for proper handling and care. The virtual specimens to be produced will be used in classes as educational materials, but will also assist in the long-term preservation of the remains.

Brief description of student responsibilities?

Student will use an Einscan S 3d tabletop scanner to scan human skeletal elements. This will also include some analysis and curation work.
