Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?

I go to London every year and gather archival materials for the Rose Playhouse, a registered Ancient Monument and active archaeological site with promise of future development and improved public access. Students will be able to work on areas of the collection, and in activities that interest them and play to their strengths. This may include digitizing paper documents, photographs, etc. and creating digital files to be added to the growing collection. No previous experience is needed but students will be working on Mac computers, with scanners, files, fragile documents, and varied software including Adobe, Word, and the Omeka archiving software. An interest in history, good problem-solving skills, the ability to find and curate a narrative thread.

We will be weaving a new story out of a mountain of new and old materials.

The patients to do careful work and good sense of humor along the way will be helpful!

Brief description of student responsibilities?

Students will learn practices and strategies in material and digital archiving for both public history and academic scholarship while preserving the history one of the most important ancient theatre buildings we have, a Scheduled Ancient Monument. Previous URCA assistants on this project have earned the URCA Award (three times), were prepared to go on to earn graduate degrees in history, English and library science, travelled to London with me to see the Rose in person (four students in different years), and these students are included in the acknowledgements in the

online archive, etc.
